**Mr. Bill Domm (Peterborough):** Madam Speaker, I am pleased to be able to present to the House 3,722 unsolicited signatures of people from across Canada who have brought to my attention their opposition to the forced implementation of metric. This brings the total to 22,983 unsolicited signatures which have been presented to this House of Commons in less than 12 months, all of which are asking members to give due consideration to the introduction of the metric system on a voluntary basis as opposed to forced implementation, particularly in the retail food sector.

## MIRABEL AIRPORT

Question No. 83—**Mr. Cossitt:**

What was the total amount of losses suffered by taxpayers for all aspects of the operation of Mirabel airport since it was opened until the date the answer to this question is prepared?

**Mr. Robert Bockstael (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of Transport):** The total deficit for all aspects of the operation of Mirabel airport since it opened, November 29, 1975, to March 31, 1980, was \$192.6 million. This is the excess of operating and maintenance expenses (including interest and depreciation) over revenues. The deficit before providing for interest and depreciation was \$10.2 million. For the period April 1, 1980, through September 30, 1980, Mirabel will break even, before providing for depreciation expense of \$9 million.

Question No. 1,539—**Mr. McKenzie:**

1. What is the total budget for the government's Ener\$ave for the home insulation program?
