JM/SEM. 17th October, 1924. Reciprocal Interchange of Student-Teachers between Scotland and Canada. Dear Sir, I am in a position to submit to you for your observations, preliminary proposals of a scheme which my Committee have been considering for some time, towards the establishment of student-teacherships in Scotland and corresponding ones in America and in Canada in connection with the reciprocal interchange of teachers. This Memorandum must, as yet, be considered only in the light of preliminary proposals, but as such they have been submitted to, and generally approved by, my Committee. They may to some slight extent yet be modified, probably towards the extension of the statement of duties, etc., but, substantially, I think they may be considered sufficiently advanced to be founded upon. I am in communication with the American University Union in Europe, and the officials of that organisation have very willingly undertaken to approach the authorities of Teachers' College, Columbia University, New York, on the question. The preliminary proposals show that my Committee are willing to establish two student-teacherships for Session 1925-26, one for an American University and one for your University on the condition that there are reciprocal appointments, on similar conditions, from Teachers' College and your University to work in Scotland. I shall be pleased to have from you, at your early convenience, a note of any observations you may have to make upon these proposals. Meantime, should they meet with your favour, I would ask you to indicate in your reply/
