ing down their arms, and returning to the obedience of the crown within a limited time: without making any exceptions whatfoever, not even of Mr. Adams and Mr. Hancock.

By fuch a plan the principal caufes of uncafinefs and difcontent amongft the Americans would, as I conceive, be taken away, and, confequently, if they are fincere in their declarations of a defire to continue connected with Great-Britain, (as it feems highly probable that all the colonies, except those of New-England, are; and perhaps even in those colonies there may be many perfons of the fame difposition;) it feems reasonable to hope that it would be generally approved and accepted by them. And yet the fupream authority of the parliament of Great-Britain would not be given up.
