CAP. CXVI.

An Act to incorporate Peter Patterson, Esquire, and others, under the name of "The Quebec and Richmond Rail-way Company."

[10th August, 1850.]

WHEREAS the construction of a Rail-road Preamble.
from the City of Quebec, or from a point on the South shore of the River Saint Lawrence, as nearly opposite to the said City as may be found desirable, to the village of Richmond, or the neighbourhood thereof, there to connect with the Saint Lawrence and Atlantic Rail-road, would greatly contribute to the prosperity of this Province; And whereas the several persons hereinafter named are desirous to construct and maintain the said Rail-road: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and intituled, *An Act to re-unite the Provinces of Upper and Lower Canada, and for the Government of Canada*, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Peter Patterson, Certain persons incorporated.
