trace the Far-off-Metal River to its mouth, to explore the fituation of the copper mines, if any, of which indiftinct accounts had been given; and, in short, to attend to any localities which might be productive of an extended commerce, or geographical knowledge.

His first attempt was made in the close of the year 1769, when, after proceeding about two hundred miles, his Indian guides deferted him; and it was with great difficulty he regained the fettlement at Fort Prince Wales.
