

Commissioner of the Peace, he may grant a written order directed to a bailiff, commanding the butcher complained of to admit the said complainant, accompanied by a bailiff, to view the place where he kills his cattle. If the butcher shall refuse to admit them he shall for every such refusal pay twenty shillings. But if in obedience to the order he shall permit them to visit the said place, and if they shall find that the offensive smell proceeds from dirtiness and filth found there, the butcher so offending shall pay ten shillings and shall cause the filth to be removed.

VIII. No person shall kill calves or any other animal in the streets or market-places under a penalty of five shillings.

IX. No person having brought sturgeon or other large fish to market shall gut them in the streets or market-place under a penalty of five shillings.

X. No person may build in any street without having made application to the sitting Commissioner to have a line drawn for the mason's direction, under pain of having as much of the building demolished as shall be found to encroach on the street; the mason who shall build without a line so drawn to guide him in laying the foundation shall pay a fine of forty shillings.

XI. The carters shall clean the market-place in the Lower-town every Wednesday and Saturday, under a penalty of five shillings on every carter who shall refuse to assist at that work.
