

A GREAT FUTURE AHEAD FOR TORONTO

British Manufacturers Declare That This City Will Be Among the Greatest in the British Empire—City Council Will Give Assistance to Branch Factories.

That Toronto will be one of the three or four greatest cities in the British Empire was the prediction made by Leonard Palmer of the London Financial News at the luncheon given by the city to the visiting manufacturers at McKenney's yesterday. Mr. Palmer said that the city's growth had been so substantial and its future progress was so inevitable that this was a logical conclusion. The luncheon was attended by a large number of members of the city council, civic officials, representatives of the board of trade and manufacturers' association and other guests.

In welcoming the visitors on behalf of the city, Mayor Geary, who occupied the chair, said that the commercial bonds of the empire were one of the strongest agencies of imperialism and mutual understanding. He referred to Napoleon's famous epigram that England was a nation of shopkeepers, and he hoped that the mother country would always be pre-eminent in this realm, since commercialism had proved such a great source of national strength. He expressed the opinion that the visitors' stay in Toronto had been beneficial, both to the city and to the Toronto business men.

Refreshing Sights.

E. J. Caley, Norwich, complimented the city in that it had other virtues which preserved the beauty of the city. "Your streets," he said, "are one of the most refreshing sights which I have seen in Canada." The party, he said, had been impressed with the possibilities of Toronto from a commercial standpoint.

There was no doubt about Toronto's future, according to Ald. Maguire, who said that among its other virtues it was one of the best governed cities in the world. He thought the visitors would make a mistake if they overlooked Toronto in establishing or recommending the establishment of branch industries. The city council would do all in its power to assist British firms looking for Toronto. In the morning the party visited the various buildings they attended an organ recital in Convocation Hall by H. A. Moore. In the afternoon they were taken for a drive around the city by the city council. The visitors left yesterday evening for Toronto, Pa., and after viewing the sights there they will visit Hamilton, Brantford and London.
