HAPPOOD IS NOT GUILTY OF LIBEL OF JUDGE DEUEL

District Attorney Jerome Declares After Loathing of Some of His Own Witnesses.

New York, Jan. 26.—An unusually sensational trial came to an end to-day when a jury in the criminal branch of the supreme court reported that Norman Hapgood, editor of Collier's Weekly, was not guilty of criminal libel. The case had been on trial several weeks.

Prosecutor Was Pleasured. He will not attempt to disguise from the jury the fact that scores of persons of the highest social and financial standing became involved thru the efforts of the defence to prove that the statements contained in the alleged libel were correct and therefore justified.
