Henry Norman Kittson of Hamilton is petitioning the court to have the Saw Bill Lake Gold Mining Co. wound up and its assets distributed amongst the various creditors. The company has a capital of \$125,000, and indebtedness of \$16,000, which latter Mr. Kittson claims it is unable to satisfy. He is himself a creditor to the amount of \$1000, moneys loaned the concern. The mine is situated in the Upper Seine River district.
