London Controllers to Join Deputation Going to Kitchener.

The board of control will make a strong effort to have the Montreal to Windsor highway pass through London. This morning, a petition was presented, to be signed by the council, and copies sent to other municipalities. A deputation will go to Kitchener on March 29, to meet representatives from that city, Waterloo, Guelph, Brampton, St. Mary's, Stratford, and other cities. They want the highway to come through London.


