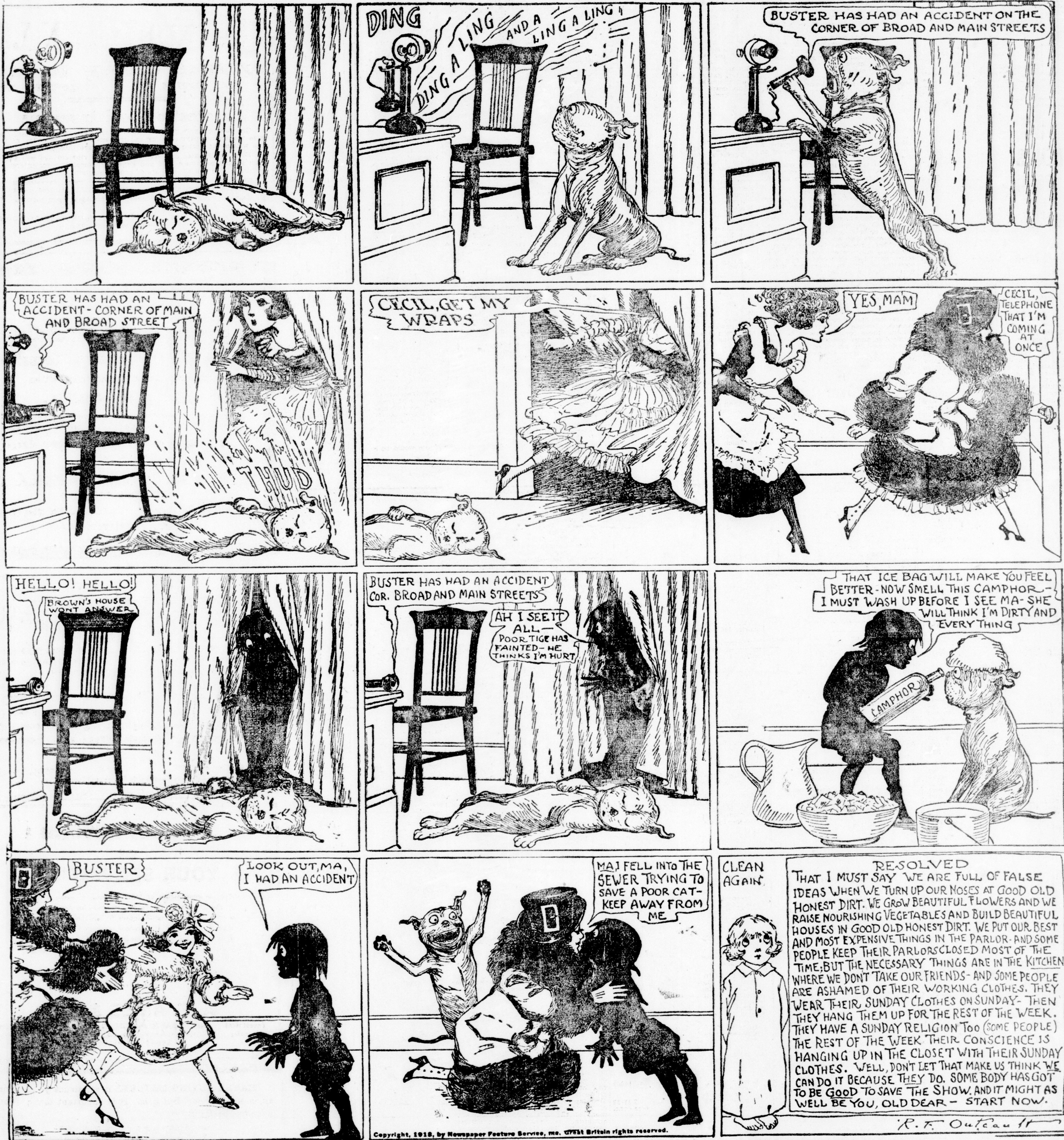

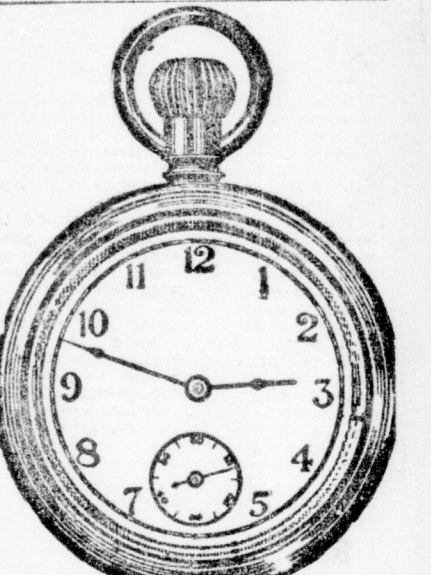

NEW FRANCHISE DRAFTED FOR MONTREAL TRAMWAY

Montreal, Jan. 18.—It is reported from Quebec, that the commission appointed to draft the franchise between the Montreal Tramways Company and the city of Montreal has valued the capital investment of the company at \$38,000,000 and will allow 5 1/2 per cent on that amount. The terms of the franchise will provide, it is said, that after this 5 1/2 and \$200,000 for the city have been deducted from the profits the balance will be divided into three parts, one for the company, another for the city, and the third to go to a fund to reduce the cost of transportation to the public.

GIVEN POWER TO BORROW.

Quebec, Jan. 18.—The bill of Montreal Catholic School Commission asking for power to borrow \$3,000,000 to raise the tax rate to 20 mills were passed by the public bills committee yesterday despite the strong protests of proprietors from Montreal. An amendment was made whereby the Protestant school board will also get the same rate, making the bill practically a public one.

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
