WOMAN'S IDEA OF PRESS WOULD BAR YELLOWISM

Most Interesting Speeches of Congress Devoted to Evils of Journalism.

It was newspaper day at the literature section of the Women's Congress yesterday. The modern social column, the comic supplement and sensational journalism, were flaged.

Arthur Stringer, the noted Canadian author, was present from New York to give his opinions upon newspaper editors. In opening he said:

"When I told my wife that I was going to tell the congress what I thought of editors, she said: 'But how can you, Arthur, when ladies will be present?'"

The speaker said that in his view newspaper editors were too near to the commercial editor to have ideals. The only revolution which had marked the past decade had been purely in the methods of journalism. The publications were issued as business enterprises.
