## SERVICE TO WEST INDIES SUFFERS UNDER CHANGE

### Fewer Ports of Call by Steamships of R. M. S. P.

### SHIPPER'S WILL BE INCONVENIENCED

### C. G. G. M. Plans Under Arrangement Since Subsidy Are Announced

Plans just announced by the Canadian Government Merchant Marine for their new service to the West Indies to alternate with the R. M. S. P. boats replacing two vessels of the latter removed on the expiration of the Government subsidy show that every port of call maintained under the old R. M. S. P. schedule will be maintained on this service, with the first sailing from this port on June 28. The R. M. S. P. however, under their new schedule of sailings every four weeks instead of fortnightly are greatly reducing their ports of call among the smaller islands.

**NOT SO GOOD SERVICE**

The new arrangement means that while there will be as many sailings as at present the service maintained will not be as good, as the C. G. M. vessels will not carry passengers and the R. M. S. P. will cut out six ports of call thus inconveniencing many shippers depending on the service. Great interest has been aroused among local shippers regarding the service to be available and many inquiries have been received at The Times-Star office.

**BEAVER TO START**

A special despatch to The Times-Star today from J. P. Doherty, C. G. M. traffic manager, contained the information that the steamer Canadian Beaver was being brought light from Halifax, where the vessel is now being fitted out, to inaugurate the first sailing from Saint John on June 28. She will be followed by the Canadian Gunner on July 26. The vessels are being brought around here light, the message said, especially to cater to the needs of the shippers in this vicinity. The service, the despatch further stated, would make the line previously made by the R. M. S. P. under the old schedule and would entail the steamers calling here first on their north bound voyages. The vessel not fitted out for carrying passengers. H. E. Kane and Co., Ltd., will represent the C. G. M. service here at present as the line has no summer office in Saint John.

**PORTS CUT OUT**

The R. M. S. P. in addition to reducing their ports and sailings by half since the removal of the \$340,000 annual subsidy have announced that there will be a drastic curtailing of the ports of call in the West Indies. Under the new schedule only Bermuda, St. Kitts, Barbadoes, Trinidad and Demerara will be touched while St. Kitts will be omitted on the north bound voyages.

This change means the cutting out of the present calls at Antigua, Montserrat, Dominica, St. Vincent and Grenada, although it was announced today at the office of William Thomson and Co., Ltd., local agent for the R. M. S. P., that if there were special inducements in passengers or freight a steamer would make a special call at any one of these ports.

**OLD SCHEDULE ENDS**

The sailing of the R. M. S. P. Chaleur from Halifax tomorrow marks the last sailing under the old schedule. The first sailing under the new one will be the R. M. S. P. Chignecto from this port on Saturday, July 18, and will remain at Halifax until July 16. She will be followed by the R. M. S. P. Chaleur from Saint John on July 30 and Halifax on Aug. 13, and the Chignecto again from this port Aug. 21, and Halifax on Sept. 3. The other two vessels at present operating on the route, the Teviot and Chaudiere, will be withdrawn after the completion of their present voyages at Saint John where they will arrive on June 29 and July 13 respectively.

In considering the combined service being given by the lines it was pointed out this morning that the service to the public was considerably poorer, than that provided by the R. M. S. P. under the subsidy. It is difficult to reach by other services, and passengers will have only a monthly service available at the larger islands while at the smaller islands there will be no passenger accommodations direct.

## WIDOW OF FORMER POLICEMAN DIES

### Mrs. Betsy Ann Hamilton Passes Away at the Age of 82 Years

The death of Mrs. Betsy Ann Hamilton, widow of Robert Hamilton, a former officer of the North End police force, occurred at the residence of her daughter, Mrs. James H. Smith, 64 Harrison street, this morning in the 82nd year of her age. Mrs. Hamilton had been in failing health for several years. She was born at Oak Point, but had spent the greater part of her life in the North End, where she was highly respected.

Four sons, two daughters, two brothers, two sisters and ten grandchildren survive. The sons are James T. of New Haven, William S. of New York, Harry H. of Medford, Mass., and Charles L. at home; the daughters, Mrs. David Magee, and Mrs. James H. Smith of this city; the brothers Thomas C. McCullum, of North Cross, N. B., and John McCullum, Adelaide street, this city; and the sisters, Mrs. M. Moore, Main street, and Mrs. M. Barton, Waterloo street.

### Saint John Young Men Leave to Board H. M. S. Capetown

The following young men left by train this morning for Halifax to join H. M. S. Capetown on Friday for naval training and sail on Saturday for Newfoundland: Russell Boddington, Reginald Dorman, Norman Magnusson, Robert McDade, Rodney McLeod, Edwin Nice, Reginald Nicholls and Ronald Linton. H. M. S. Capetown is the flagship of Admiral Ferguson, commander of the North Atlantic and West Indies Squadron, and has visited Saint John on more than one occasion. The Capetown will take on R. N. V. R. from Montreal, Toronto and Hamilton. Able Seamen James Sands and Kenneth Mowery also left for Halifax this morning.

## Assault Charge Made Against Roy Belyea

Yesterday afternoon at 4:30 o'clock Roy Belyea was arrested by Sergeant Dykeman and Police Journey on a charge of assault, and was allowed out on a deposit of \$20. He appeared before Magistrate Henderson this morning and at first pleaded guilty, but changed his mind to not guilty, after J. P. Pringle announced that he represented G. E. Logan, who was acting for the accused, but was absent in Fredericton. The hearing was postponed until tomorrow morning. R. G. McInerney appeared for the prosecution. It was said the police were called to Herbert Newton's house on last Tuesday evening on the complaint that Roy Belyea had beaten him and had done damage to the furniture. Efforts it was said, were being made to effect a settlement.
