towards the fence posts, south, and the feet pointing north. I saw something between his legs, but I was not sure what that was.

(W) We then left the spot. No one touched the body. We headed for Michael Chalifoux's place, and I parted with my husband and father-in-law, just past the empty shack. I went home, and they went on to Michael Chalifoux's place.

(X) When I arrived home, Jean was sitting on the foot of the baby's bed, with the baby on her lap, and Julien was still under the bed. I told Jean "that man killed himself". Jean said: "Did he really do it?". Julien then came out from under the bed, and said he was going home. I looked out of the door to see if my husband, my father-in-law, and Michael Chalifoux had returned to the body, and as I opened the door, Julien went out saying that he was going home. I did not see him again, till he came back to our place with the police, I think in the forenoon of the same day.

(Y) After Julien left, Jean made a bed on the floor, and started to cry, telling her girl: "Poor little girl, you have no more Dad". I laid down on my bed. I did not go to sleep. I had been on the bed for awhile, when I heard some one talking outside. I got up and looked out of the window. There was a light by the body, -a lantern, and a flashlight, and I saw a woman there. I went and opened the door, and there was the nurse from the Agency, near the door. She asked me if she could come into the house. I said: "Yes", and she came in. She said to Jean, that she was sorry to have to tell her that her husband was dead, that if he had been still alive, she could have helped him. Jean was crying. The nurse wanted to go back to the Agency, and I told her what way to go out to where Charlie Anderson was waiting for her.

(Z) I did not see any mark on Dan Williar's nose while he was alive, but I did see a dark mark on his nose, when I was at the funeral at Sucker Creek.

(A)a I do not know any more about the shooting than I have told you. I believe that Dan shot himself. I do not believe that any one shot him.

(B)b I lied to Corpl. Faulkner when he took my first statement, I lied at the inquest, but I told the truth at the court (Preliminary hearing) but I held some of the facts back, because Julien Lalonde had asked us not to tell everything. I am telling everything tonight.

18. After having taken above statements, Jean Williar was brought into the room where these statements were read to her in the presence of both parties making the same, and they were signed in her presence. She then made the following statement:-

(A) I, Jean Williar was present when the above statements were taken from Albert, and Rosalie Williar. I heard them speak and make them, and they are telling the truth. I want to say this. It is not the police that want me to speak. It is I who want to say that they told the truth. The police told me that I do not have to speak if I don't want to, but I want to speak.

(B) I do not want to say more.
