Q. Can you say whether or not the accused, Lieut. Knox, was under open arrest on 3 Sep 42 and if he had permission to proceed to Brighton? permission to proceed Mr. Knox under open arrest. I. A. On'21 Aug 42 I placed Mr. Knox under open arrest. I have not at any time since that date released him. was not with the Regt on 3 Sep 42.

Q. You have not released him?

A. He was still under arrest unless released by someone else.

Q. Had he any permission to proceed to Brighton? A. I had not given him permission.

Defence declines to cross examine.
