CLOSING STOCK LETTER.

Chicago, Ill., Aug. 23.—Today's stock market was of a rather nondescript character, showing a whole lot of little tendencies of price and reflecting rather divergent views as to the immediate trend of values. Activity ran to specialties with little or no public interest at any quarter. From a bearish standpoint, however, there was a disappointing lack of liquidation in the leading issues such as was expected to follow yesterday's weakness. Some interests who were an ultimately higher level of prices expressed the opinion that a further shake-out and a more active market was ahead would be a wholesome development, but whenever a definite tendency developed to advance prices resulted. At present there is some prejudice against the railroads in anticipation of a possible adjustment of earnings. There is also unfavourable to the leading lines, but this factor is largely offset by the increasing volume of tonnage throughout all sections of country. The industrial field seems more responsive to bull operations especially the copper stocks, many of which will likely increase dividends in the near future as the result of favorable trade conditions and the high price of the metal. It now looks as if tomorrow will see the last of the present session of congress and that should prove a factor of strength next week.
