Assaulted on the Ferry Boat. A story is current around the city which, if true, requires investigation by the Railway Company into the conduct of the employees on the Ferry. Some days ago, a laboring man who lives in Carlton but works in the city, started from home with six cents in his pocket to pay his fare going and returning. The money consisted of a five cent piece and one cent. On coming over in the morning he gave the five cent piece to the collector who retained it three cents and handed back one cent and a uncurrent copper coin. The man objected to the latter, but was told it was all the collector had, and that it would be all right when he paid his fare in the evening. If the man would tell the facts of the case to the collector who would then be on duty. The man then took the change, and when crossing the ferry in the evening tendered the two cents and the uncurrent coin. Another collector was on duty and refused to receive the money. The man told him it was all the money he had, and reminded him of the promise of the collector who was on duty in the morning. He was told that the present collector had nothing to do with the agreement of the other, and his money was again demanded. As he had only the two cents and the copper he could not pay. When the boat reached Carlton the man attempted to go ashore, but was seized by the collector, who called one of the crew to his aid, and used him very roughly. In the scuffle the boat was torn, he was knocked down, and otherwise ill used. As he was entirely innocent of any fault in the matter of the money, he thinks he was treated rather than as he deserved, and is now trying at the legal proceedings to obtain satisfaction in the matter.
