An Act to regulate the Qualifications of Practitioners in Medicine and Surgery in Upper Canada.

WHEREAS it is expedient that persons requiring medical aid should preamble. be enabled to distinguish qualified from unqualified Practitioners; Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows :-

- 1. This Act shall be known and cited as the Medical Act for Upper Short title. Canada.
  - 2. This Act shall take effect from and after the first day of one thousand eight hundred and

When Act. shall take effect.

- 3. A Council, which shall be styled "The General Council of Me-Council es-10 "dical Education and Registration of Upper Canada." hereinafter referred to as "The Council," shall be established.
  - 4. The Council shall consist of one person, chosen from time to time, Composition by each of the following Colleges and bodies:-

The University of Toronto,
The University of Trinity College, Toronto, 15 The University of Victoria College,

The University of Queen's College, The Toronto School of Medicine,

and by every other college or body in Upper Canada, by law authoriz-20 ed or hereafter to be authorized to grant Medical or Surgical Degrees or Certificates of qualification to practise Medicine, Surgery and Midwifery, or either, and of twelve persons to be elected from among the registered practitioners of medicine of Upper Canada, as hereinafter is provided.

- 5. Members of the council, representing medical corporations, must Qualification of members of be qualified to be registered under this Act. Council.
- 6. The members of the council shall be elected for a period of three Resignation years; any member may resign his appointment at any time by letter, and vacancies addressed to the President of the council; and upon the death or re-30 signation of any member of the council, the council may proceed to supply the vacancy so created, by electing from the members of the profession registered under this Act, a person to fill such vacancy, if such deceased or resigning member was originally elected by the profession, but not otherwise; and if such member was elected by any of 35 the said colleges or bodies, such college or body may supply the vacancy. All acts of the council shall be valid notwithstanding any such vacancies.
