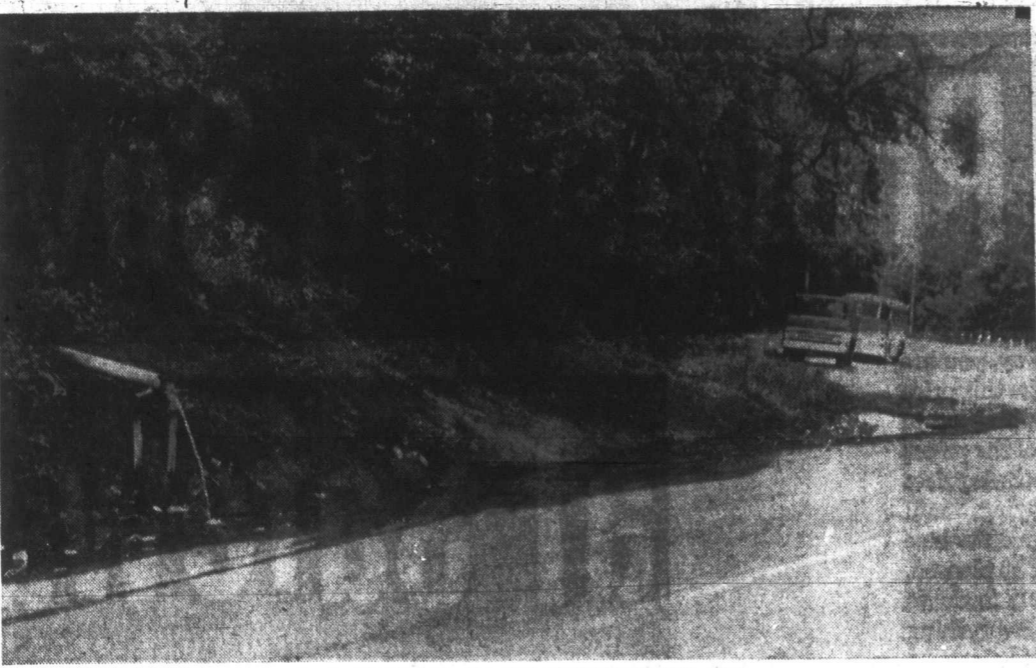


# Kiwanis president elected

T. R. Johnson, a Denver Banking and Finance executive, was elected President of Kiwanis International last week at the organization's 55th Annual Convention in Detroit, Michigan, according to Fred Schafheitlin, President of the Kiwanis Club of Dixie.

As leader of the international service organization, Johnson will be spokesman for its 275,000 members in 3,700 clubs throughout the United States, Canada, Mexico, Europe, Central and South America, the Caribbean, the Far East, and the Southwest Pacific Area. He succeeds Robert F. Weber, a partner in a Detroit investment and real estate firm, who has held the position since October 1, 1969.

Prior to becoming President of Kiwanis International, Johnson served one year as treasurer, one year as vice-president, a special one-year term as International Trustee, and two two-year terms as trustee. He has served as the

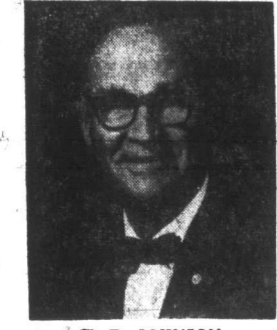

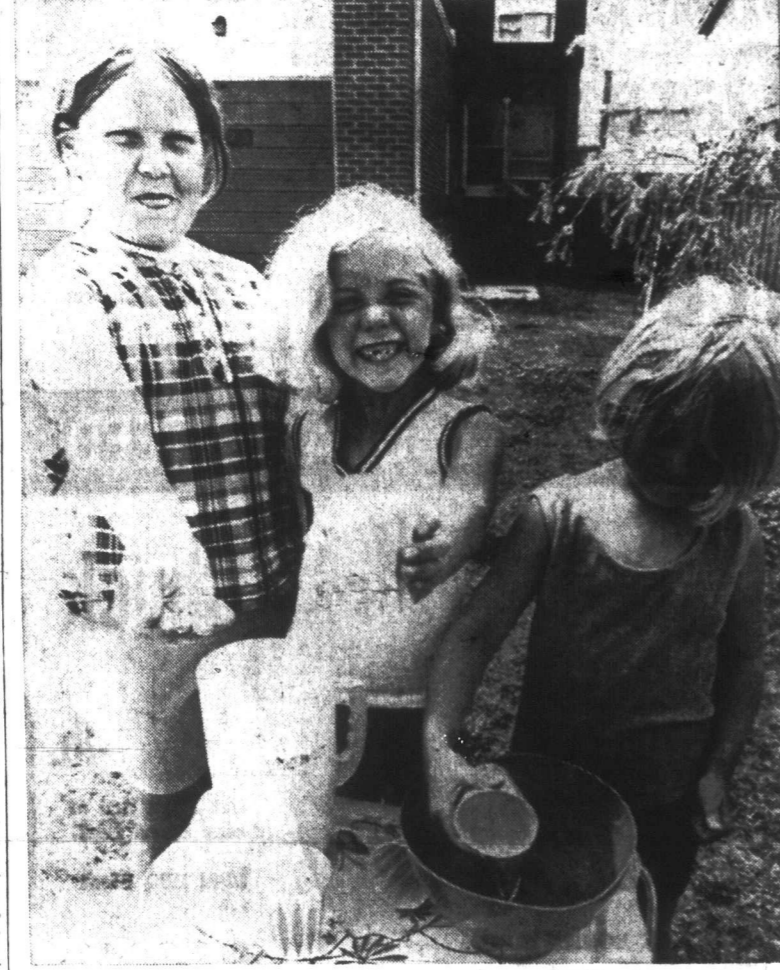

# Brock accepts Grade 12 students

ST. CATHARINES — Three local students were among some 124 Grade 12 graduates who enrolled in Brock University July 6 to start a six-week course to determine their adaptability to university teaching methods.

Those who indicate by their performance that they are ready for university without going through Grade 13 will be offered spots in Brock's 1970-1971 freshman class.

The students from Mississauga are: Gladys Pardu, 3455 Havenwood Dr., Peter Coleman, 1321 Ludbrook Court and from Port Credit: Filippo Carusi, 1432 Sherway Dr.

Students are required to take four courses. They must take one discipline from each of the following areas: Humanities, Sciences and Social Studies. The fourth subject can be an option of Mathematics or Languages, or they can take an additional subject from one of the above mentioned areas.

In order to join the course students had to be recommended by their high school principal and guidance officer. More than 775 applications were received by Brock.

# Creative drama offered

MISSISSAUGA — Teenagers in the 12-15 year age group will have the opportunity to take part in a creative drama program here this summer.

# Forest fires down

OTTAWA—Forest fire activity was considerably below averages throughout Canada during the month of May, the Canadian Forestry Service stated today.

So far during the current forest fire season there have been 1,707 fires with the affected area totalling 28,000 acres. Over the same period last year, 1,548 fires ravaged 33,000 acres of forest.

There were an estimated 1,394 fires which damaged or destroyed 25,000 acres of woodlands. Over the previous decade there was an average of 1,542 fires in May covering 300,000 acres of forest. In May of 1969 there were 1,226 fires with a total area of 51,000 acres.
