

Forest fires down

OTTAWA—Forest fire activity was considerably below average throughout Canada during the month of May, the Canadian Forestry Service stated today.

There were an estimated 1,394 fires which damaged or destroyed 25,000 acres of woodlands. Over the previous decade there was an average of 1,542 fires in May covering 369,000 acres of forest. In May of 1969 there were 1,226 fires with a total area of 51,000 acres. So far during the current forest fire season there have been 1,707 fires with the affected area totalling 28,000 acres. Over the same period last year, 1,548 fires ravaged 33,-


