Mr. Nickle's Motion, 1919:

When Prime Minister, Sir Robert Borden, was in England,
subject again introduced by motion of Mr. Nickle,
which urged abolition of all titles.

Mr. Richardson moved an amendment, recommending extinction
of all hereditary titles at death of holder.

Special Committee and Address to His Majesty:

Sir Thomas White moved for appointment special committee.

Committee (Mr. Nickle Chairman) reported to House, May 4, 1919.

Mr. Nickle moved report be adopted, May 22, 1919.

Mr. Nicholson moved report be referred back to committee
for further consideration.

Nicholson amendment defeated 96 - 43.

Motion carried on division.

Motion of Mr. Nickle that address be engrossed and
transmitted to His Majesty - carried.
