benefits of it for power production. That is a matter of federal interest upon which the Federal Government, as the guardian of all Canadian interests abroad, must take its own responsibility, even though the representatives of the Province chiefly concerned should be willing or even anxious to see an improvident and unsafe kind of procedure adopted.)
