As to the content of plans for international cooperation, the theme that peace, security and prosperity are alike indivisible should be stressed. In the same way, a natural line of development might be forecast from mutual aid through international relief and rehabilitation to the expansion of world trade.

A new approach to mutual aid and relief and rehabilitation might be made through stressing their importance in the maintenance of full employment and full production during the war and in the period of transition until two-way trade on a large scale is once more possible. The example of President Roosevelt might be followed and emphasis laid on the "mutuality" of mutual aid, especially in the case of the British.

Full Employment.

Even at the risk of apparent contradiction of statements by other Ministers, it would seem wise to emphasize the magnitude of the problem of maintaining productive and remunerative employment during the period of demobilizing

the armed forces and re-converting industry when work will be required for probably a million and a half men and women now in the forces or in war industries.

It will clearly be out of the question to forecast specific employment projects at the beginning of the session.
