Memorandum for the Prime Minister:

Miss Gibb of the Toronto Star telephoned this morning in connection with the presentation which is being made to Miss Barbara Ann Scott of the Marsh Trophy which is conferred annually on the outstanding Canadian athlete for the year. The presentation will be made at a dinner this evening. Miss Scott will be the first woman to have received the award and also the first native of Ottawa. The Marsh Trophy is sponsored by the Toronto Star, and Miss Gibb states that Mr. Atkinson is very interested in it. In the circumstances, she was wondering whether there would be any possibility of having Miss Scott comeover to your office this afternoon, in order to have a photograph taken of you congratulating her which would be published in the Star. I told Miss Gibb that you were very busy and that to-day was a particularly difficult day, so that I could not hold out much hope that you would be able to meet her request. If by any chance anything can be done, they would like to get the photograph off on to-night's train for Toronto.
