- 4 How shortly after ?

  A I can't say, Sir.

  Q And do you know whether the percels were delivered?

  A What percels, Sir?

  Q Wean't it you that put in evidence that it was fifteen to seventeen percels?

  A There were fifteen to seventeen percels given to Sergeam Harvey.

  Q And were these percels delivered?

  A as near as I know, yes.

  Q T o the Japanese staff?
  - A as near as 1 know, yes.
  - And one of them went to the Camp Commander ?
  - A That is true, Sir.
  - I think the t you were aware, Sergeant -Major, that certain members in the Camp maintained a daily diary?
  - A There is only one can to my knowledge, Sir, that kept a diary.
  - And he kept a daily diary ?
  - A No. Sir, this man did not keep a daily diary. He kept a record of some of the food in the Camp.
  - Q Adaily record?
  - Yes, Sir.
  - Q As a matter of fact you were concerned in that diary at one time ?
  - A I was somewhat, Sir.
  - I think that possibly be lost the diary and you got it back or helped him get it back?
  - A Something like that, Sir.
  - Q Did you ever see the dia ry?
  - A Not to have a good look at it, Sir. I believe it was written on blue paper in percil. It was not a book actually. It was just a sheet of paper.
  - Q Do you know of the information he put in it?
  - A Yes, Sir. I believe he had just the food Issued daily to the prisoners of war.
