At the afternoon session, the report of the committee on Nationalization of Records and Advanced Registry will be presented.—R. Reid, Secretary.

Hopeful. The Red Rose strain is noted as one of the very best dual-purpose families, and this herd contains a number of choice representatives. The herd is in excellent condition. There are 20 breeding cows, all regular breeders, 12 heifers and 12 bulls, making an offering that for rich breeding and superior individuality are seldom offered by auction.

Mr. M. H. Gardner, Supt. Advanced Registry, reports for American Holstein-Friesian Association that during the period from Nov. 3rd to Dec. 6th, 1905, records of 81 cows have been accepted, five of which were begun more than eight months after freshening. All made seven-day records; one made a fourteen-day, and four made thirty-day records. The averages by ages were as follows: Twenty-one full-aged cows averaged: age, 7 years 2 months 16 days; days from calving, 23; milk, 417.7 lbs.; per cent. fat, 3.46; fat, 11.217 lbs. Ten four-year-olds averaged: age, 4 years 6 months 4 days; days from calving, 18; milk, 380.4 lbs.; per cent. fat, 3.42; fat, 13.233 lbs. Three three-year-olds averaged: age, 3 years 1 month; days from calving, 11; milk, 351.3 lbs.; per cent. fat, 3.42; fat, 11.820 lbs. Twenty-two two-year-olds averaged: age, 2 years 4 months 25 days; days from calving, 32; milk, 289.0 lbs.; per cent. fat, 3.28; fat, 9.472 lbs. One one-year-old, the record of Copia, was also notable; she produced milk from 391.6 lbs. milk at 9 months of 2 years 5 months 9 days stated above, this was 17 lbs. 1.6 ozs. of extra milk, nearly 49 gallons of record from a two-year-old first calf needs no further
