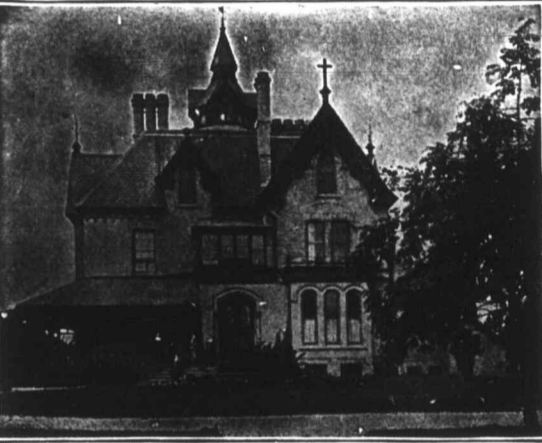

Hundreds of people from all parts of North Staffordshire visited Blorton Church, near Stoke-on-Trent, on a recent Sunday, to hear the Rev. Prebendary Hutchinson, vicar of the parish, preach his first sermon in his 100th year. Mr. Hutchinson was born on August 25, 1810. Scores of visitors could not gain admission to the church. The service was conducted by the Rev. W. S. Hutchinson, the Vicar's son, and Prebendary Hutchinson occupied a seat in the chancel. When sermon time arrived he walked unaided, to the pulpit, ascended the stone steps, and delivered an extempore sermon of fourteen minutes' duration. It was a plain, simple, sermon, appealing for preparation for future life. He said he

stood as it were, between the living and the dead. He had received innumerable letters of congratulation on attaining his 100th year, but the most appropriate was that which quoted:—

Another milestone safely passed

Along life's toilsome road;

Another year begun to-day

In closer touch with God

The vicar afterwards walked between lines of spectators to the church gates, many people offering their congratulations. On seeing the crowd gathered, he smilingly exclaimed, "What! you want another sermon?"

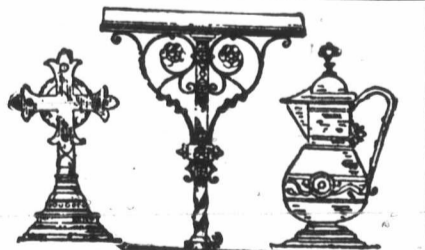
