and I think the Demicion government should put up a cold sterage system throughout the whole Dominior. All the governments should work in examination so that we could have our produce-shipped to the British market in a chilled state. In this respect we in Canada are in a very favorable position. While Australia and New Zealand, dwing to their distance from the British market must freeze their produce in order to get them to that market, we, on account of our nearness to the British market, can ship our produce in the chilled state. In that way the chilled products of Canada will bring practically as much on the British market as the newly slaughtered products over there, while the frozen goods of these other countries will bring a much smaller price. Therefore, we have a very great advantage over them.

The Hog Commission

The Hon. Minister spoke of the appointment of a commission to go to Europe to look into the conditions of the log industry there. They went to England, Scotland, Ireland, Denmark and Holland, to study the conditions in those countries. It is not likely that anyone in the province has seen the quantity of grain grown on an acre in a pile by itself, and the reader will realize what a great interest will be taken in a building where proabably 50 to 100 such exhibits will be on view from all over the province. Some districts are taking a particular interest in this feature as in the case of Lloydminster Agricultural Society who have already secured six exhibits from their district. The other features of the exhibition promise to be of more than ordinary interest, and the excellent music and attractions, low rates and special trains will undoubtedly make the attendance the largest yet. The entries close on the 18th of June.
