that he subsequently practised as a Physician and Surgeon in the city of Glasgow, until the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, in which year he emigrated to Canada, and that ever since that period he has continued in extensive and successful practice as a physician and surgeon in the county of Chateauguay, and has prayed that an Act may be passed authorizing him to present himself for examination before the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Lower Canada, and enabling him upon passing such examination to be admitted to the practice of Medicine and Surgery in Lower Canada, without completing any further course of study; and whereas it is reasonable and just that such prayer be granted: Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:

1. It shall be lawful for the said Donald Alexander Livings- D. A. Livingston to present himself before the Board of Examiners of the ton may obtain college of Physicians and Surgeons of Lower Canada, without examination following any further course of study, and if the said Donald without any further course of study. Alexander Livingston be found by the said examiners to be further course of study. properly qualified, he shall be entitled to obtain a license to practise Medicine, Surgery and Midwifery, according to the by-laws and regulations of the said college.

2. This: Act shall be deemed a Public Act.

CAP. CXVIII.

An Act to authorize the admission of Henry Hart Coyne to practise as an Attorney and Solicitor in the Courts of Law and Equity in Upper Canada.

[Assented to 18th September, 1865.]

HEREAS Henry Hart Coyne, of the City of London, Preamble. Esquire, hath, by his petition to the Legislature, represented that on the second day of August, one thousand eight hundred and sixty, he was duly articled to William Proudfoot, a practising Attorney and Solicitor of Her Majesty's Superior Courts of Law and Equity for Upper Canada; that he served under the said articles and an assignment thereof to the Honorable John Wilson, until the twenty-fifth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, when the said the Honorable John Wilson was appointed a Judge of Her Majesty's Court of Common Pleas at Toronto; that from the said twenty-fifth day of July until the seventeenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, he served as clerk in the office of Philip Mackenzie, a practising Attorney of Her Majesty's above mentioned Courts; that by reason of a technical defect in part of his service under the said articles of clerkship he did not complete his term of service thereunder; that
