Messages from His Excellency.

Agreeably to the intimation given by him at the opening of the present session of the Provincial Parliament, the Lieutenant Governor now transmits to the House of Assembly an extract from a Despatch dated 23th December, 1837, from Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies, with several documents appendant thereto, explaining the terms and conditions on which Her Majesty's Government propose to surrender to the Provincial Legislature, the disposal of the Casual and Territorial Revenue of the Crown in Upper Canada.

Message with certain documents on the subject of the cession of the Casual and Territorial Revenue.

The information on this subject, of which the House of Assembly are already in possession, through Sir Francis Head's Message of the 14th February, 1837, and the clear and perspicuous detail of the views and intentions of Her Majesty's Government in relation to it, afforded by Lord Glenelg's Despatch already alluded to, in a great measure supersede the necessity for any other communications respecting it.

From an earnest desire, however, to bring this important question under the consideration of the House of Assembly, accompanied with every sort of information which can in any way assist in the satisfactory determination of it, the Lieutenant Governor has been induced to annex the undermentioned papers to Lord Glenelg's Despatch:
