The members of a club pay the required fees and enjoy the stipulated privileges. But a club is not a church. In spirit, in motive, and in point of view the one is radically different from the other. The spirit of the one is frankly and unabashedly selfish, the spirit of the other is the essential spirit of unselfishness; service in the one is motived by the quid pro quo principle, in the other the service is its own reward; the outlook of the one is on its own elect and privileged members, the other yearns most of all for those who are without. No, a club is not a church.

And an institution is not changed from a club into a church by changing its ritual or by trickling it out in the toggery of religion. The singing of Psalms, the preaching of sermons, the observance of sacraments, and the affectation of a pious pose are not the essentials of a church. It is not a matter of creed. The easiest doctrines may be spoken in the softest words, or every paragraph may be blue and sulphurous, and inescapably damn-There may be eloquence in the pulpit and art in the choir-loft and conscious respectability in the pew, or all may be alike stale, flat, and unprofitable.
