Central Baptist Association.

This Association, which comprises the four counties of Halifax, Hants, Kings and Lunenburg, commenced its 44th annual session in the Windsor Baptist church on Friday afternoon last, with about one hundred delegates in attendance.

The new church at Kingston was received into the Association, and the right hand of fellowship extended to the Rev. Stephen March, pastor.

Committee on Missions reported through their chairman, Rev. A. C. Chute. The workers are fewer this year, on account of the home coming of some of the missionaries, through ill health.

Mr. H. Y. Corey, who is soon to be married, will join the mission, and also Miss Clark, who has been training for the work.

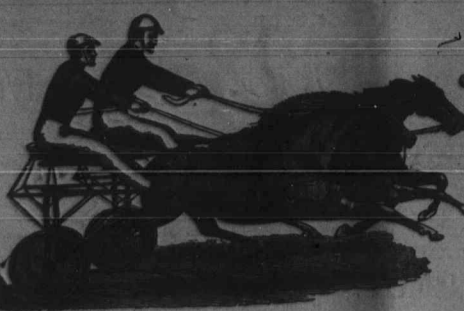
The Home Mission field, which covers considerable ground, has a debt of over \$8,000 resting upon it, which has necessitated retrenchment. Aid has been given to forty-seven fields, however, eight of which are in the Central Association.

Addresses on Missions were made by Rev. A. Colson and Rev. A. Barwash, the latter from the Grande Ligne Mission.

The committee on denominational literature reported, and during the discussion which followed the Messenger and Visitor came in for a large share of attention, the general expression being that the paper should be strengthened rather than cheapened, as advocated by a few.

The committee on statistics reported as follows: Present membership, 8,805; Admitted by baptism, 244; Admitted by experience, 12; Restored to membership, 120; Received by letter, 120; Total, 9,301.
