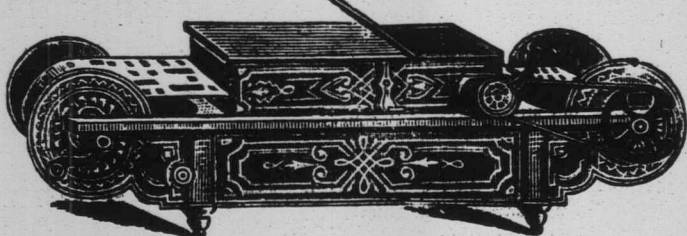

# CANADA'S PEER.

## HISTORY OF THE BARON OF LONGUEUIL

The only Canadian baron that of Longueuil or Longueville which has just been recognized by the Queen. The patent signed by Louis XIV. in favor of Charles Le Moyne, one of the most illustrious soldiers of France, who lived at Longueville opposite Ville Marie (Montreal) a fort supported by strong towers of stone masonry, with a guard, several large dwellings, a church, with a farm yard, dove cote, and a large riding servants, horses, and equipment all within the area of the fort." The registers of the prior Council of Quebec contain the royal patent "done at Versailles, the 27th January, 1717 which reads as follows:—

"By the grace of God, King of France and Navarre, to all of us: It being an attribute of greatness and of our justice reward those whose courage and merit led them to perform great deeds; and taking consideration the services which have been rendered to us by the late Charles Le Moyne, seigneur of Longueville, who France A. D. 1649 to reside New France, where his valor and fidelity were so often conspicuous in the wars against the Iroquois, that our governors lieutenant governors in country employed him in military expedition and in negotiation or treaty of peace of all of which duties he acquitted himself to their entire satisfaction (2) that after him Charles Le Moyne, Esq., his eldest son, so brave a father, bore his youth either in France, where he served as a lieutenant in the Regiment de St. Laurent, or as captain in a naval detachment in Canada since 1687, when he had an arm shot off by the Iroquois while fighting near "Canoë," &c. &c. Here follows a cord of the exploits of the Moyne, and then comes the royal mandamus: "For causes; of our special grace power, and royal authority have created, erected, raised, decorated, and do create, raise and decorate by the said patent, signed by our hand, the said estate and seignory of Longueville, situated in the country of Canada, with name, title and dignity of barony, the same to be fully and truly enjoyed by said Charles Le Moyne children and heirs and descendants of the same, subject to the laws of the country of Paris, in force in Canada together with the name, title and dignity of a baron; and it is the pleasure that he shall defend and quality himself baron.
