

LOCAL AND OTHER ITEMS.

REVEREND WALLACE, killed at the St. Mary's, was buried at Quebec on Monday last.

The body of James Johnston, formerly of Annapolis, has been stolen from the grave, at Lower Montserrat.

LAST-GOVERNOR ARBENZ, of Quebec, sent \$100 to the fund for the relief of the sufferers by the St. Xavier fire.

LATE OTTAWA advised us that a light established on the breakwater pier at South West, has been put in operation.

On Friday last, a brick of gold, valued at \$2,000, was brought to Halifax from the mines at Oxford, Halifax County, N. S.

The body of John Roby, pier clerk on the wrecked steamer Fenwick, was found about a mile from the wreck, and interred at Sable.

At Rat Portage, a few days ago, a German laborer named Rayner was killed in a saw mill, by the saw breaking and cutting his head off.

SIR JOHN MACDONALD received a large number of congratulatory telegrams on the 17th, in reference to the sweeping victory in Compton.

REPORTERS from South Carolina are to the effect that many of the crops have been seriously injured by the heat that will have to be replanted.

The British House of Commons, on the 17th, by a vote of 201 to 160, rejected Labouchere's motion to abolish hereditary peerages in the House of Lords.

FLAMES from millers were lately in full force in San Francisco, Cal., on the 16th, by the bursting of a mould and the scattering of red hot metal over the mill.

A GREAT deal of damage has been done throughout Austria by the storm. At least eight persons were killed by lightning, and a number of houses burned.

The funeral of Major Storr, the victim of the St. Xavier fire, took place in Quebec on Sunday last, and was one of the most imposing affairs ever seen in the ancient capital.

The Merchants Bank of F. E. Kidwell, will, to-day, move into their new quarters in the building formerly occupied by the Bank of Prince Edward Island, on Street George Street.

His LORDSHIP THE BISHOP, who accompanied by Rev. John J. McDonald, had been on a visit to Nova Scotia and New Brunswick during last week, returned home Saturday evening.

The barkentine steamer, Capt. Ledwell, owned by Packer Bros. & Co., arrived at this port on Sunday last, after a passage of forty-two days from Liverpool. She brought a cargo of general merchandise.

On the 9th inst, a sheep belonging to P. S. Hughes, Bedford Station, gave birth to five lambs. Four of the lambs were living; one died shortly afterwards; the other three are as full of life as any lambs could be. The sheep is a thorough-bred Cotswold.

COMMANDER GORRY left Ottawa for Halifax on the 17th, carrying the official instructions regarding the fishery protection service for the present season. It is understood that no important changes are made from those of last season.

THE event of the season will be the mammoth Tea at Trundle, on the 10th of July. All who wish to spend a pleasant day should hold themselves in reserve for this tea, as it will, without any doubt, eclipse anything of the kind ever held in Charlottetown.

The regatta at Trundle, W. T., on Saturday last, was a grand success. Twenty-five thousand people witnessed the race. The single scull race started at about six o'clock. O'Connor won in 14.02, with Peterborough second, in 14.04. Hanson third, in 14.14; Lou Fourty, 14.15. The course was two and a quarter miles.

A TORNAADO swept the northern portion of Texas on Friday last, and did great damage to crops. At Forestburg, Montague county, a schoolhouse was blown down; two children were killed and many hurt. Three of the scholars are missing. Telegraph and telephone communication have been cut off, and there are fears that greater loss of life occurred.

WHILE an outward-bound freight train was shunting cars on the Grand Trunk at Dorval, near Lachine, P. Q., on the 17th inst, it was run into by a second freight train from Montreal, and also derailed by a third freight coming east. All hands jumped for their lives and escaped. Two engines and twenty-four freight cars, with their contents, were completely destroyed. The total damage is from \$80,000 to \$100,000.

SEVERAL last week the Feast of St. Dunstan, patron saint of this parish and protector of the diocese. High Mass was sung by Rev. John J. McDonald, and the sermon of the day was preached by Rev. P. A. Over 1000 men working along the water front, Brooklyn, N. Y., demand 35 cents an hour in lieu of 20 cents, the rate that has been in force. It is expected to include all men working along the river front. A number of men's lives at the other party unaltered. The utmost quiet has been preserved.

While Hunt Rochester, accompanied by friends, was walking in Regent street London on Saturday night last, he met M. Fildes. Angry words were exchanged and Fildes threatened to strike Rochester unless he assented to a duel. Rochester drew a revolver and was about to fire at Fildes when a bystander seized the weapon. A policeman arrested the two men and took them to the station, where Fildes charged Rochester with assault. The revolver was fully charged. Rochester was bailed.

Father O'Donovan testified before the Parnell commission on the 17th inst. He said the nightlights at the Parnell house were lit by the Parnells. He had threatened witness, who was under protection by the police while he was connected with the league at that place. Father O'Donovan attributed the increase of crime during the Parnell trial to the church on forty Sundays. The commission will not make their report to the House of Commons until February 1890.

A special from Akron, O., of the 15th inst, says: The prisoners in the county jail, all indicted for sanitary offenses, made an attempt to escape last evening. Harry Burns, their leader, had unlocked the heavy corridor door by means of a hardwood key he had made after getting an impression of the lock, when Mrs. W. B. Gamble, the deputy sheriff's wife, who was the only adult in the front part of the jail, ran in and shut the door, which was made of light iron bars. The prisoners were advancing on this, when Gamble seized a revolver and cried out: "The first one that touches this door is a dead man!" The prisoners could easily have broken down the door, but the locked revolver held them at bay until the arrival of Sheriff Hunt, when Mrs. Gamble's daughter called out by telephone. The prisoners were then secured and put in their cells.

His LORDSHIP RICE, the newly appointed Minister to Russia, died suddenly on the 16th inst., at the Fifth Avenue Hotel, New York. He was a great. Rice had been suffering from rheumatism for several days, but was not supposed to be in any danger. He intended to sail for Europe on the 15th, but was prevented by illness. Dr. Fuller says Rice has been ill during the entire spring, and generally run down from overwork in preparing to go abroad. The case had not been considered dangerous, however, up to 11 o'clock the night before he died. DIARRHEA is beginning to be felt in the coal district of Germany, in consequence of the strike of miners. A committee has appealed for funds. A number of West Phalian newspapers have opened subscription lists. The number of strikers and dependents is estimated at 100,000. Hundreds of miners have returned work under the protection of troops. Many strikers are wavering. The employers in Witten district have offered to increase the wages without altering the hours of labor. The offer may possibly be accepted. The strikers' committee have issued placards urging the strikers to maintain peace. Placards are posted in many places warning peaceful citizens to remain indoors after sunset. Placards are also posted urging strikers to commit violence.
