Owing to the rough water and prevailing strong E. winds blowing on the shore, only a few traps could be set, and these in very sheltered places. One in a choice berth did very well for three days but owing to the increasing winds could not continue. Four traps are fishing, but no dorics, skiffs or boats, and regular operations have not yet commenced.

H. M. S. "Briton," at St. John's, N. F., 26th May, 1917.

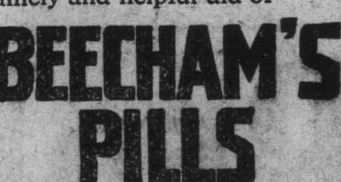
