Legislative Council.

The Council resumed its sitting at 4.15 yesterday.
 The Income, Tax and Profits Tax Bill were read a third time.
 The bill respecting Grand Bank Harbour went through Committee; and the God Liver Oil Inspection Bill and Local Affairs bills passed second reading.
 In moving the second reading of the bill providing for the inspection of Food on Sealing Steamers, the Hon. W. J. Ellis stated that on several occasions complaints had been brought under the notice of the Government regarding food distributed at the Seal Fishery, and the object of the bill was to have an inspection on each ship to see that proper food was served.
 Hon. W. B. Grieve said that if complaints had been sent to the Government the House should be given a chance to see them, and the bill should not be rushed through. He thought that something more definite should be advanced and that, personally, he regarded the bill as being most pernicious.
 Hon. R. K. Bishop moved that the bill be deferred until such time as the leader of the Government should produce the proofs.
 Hon. Mr. Ellis promised that the information would be ready by next sitting, and the second reading was deferred till to-day.
 Hon. Mr. Squires complained of not having received any reply to his request to have the report of the Government Engineer tabled, after which the House adjourned.
