ST. PATRICK'S DAY.
How the Seventeenth Was Celebrated
Canada and the States.

TORONTO, March 17.—A special service to commemorate St. Patrick's day was held in St. Michael's Cathedral this morning. Subsequently a procession paraded the streets. The annual dinner of the Irish Protestant Benevolent Society took place

in the evening. There was a large gathering and the affair passed off very successfully. The mayor presided, Clark Walla M.P., Col. G. T. Denison, Goldwin Smith, James Beatty, Q.C., and Rev. Dr. Fe were among the guests of the evening.

KINGSTON, Ont., March 17.—The various Irish societies celebrated the anniversary of their patron saint in an enthusiastic manner, the brethren attending divine service at St. Mary's Cathedral, where a sermon was delivered by Rev. F. Kehoe, rector of Wicklow county. The procession was large.

OTTAWA, March 17.—St. Patrick's in Ottawa was one of the brightest and clearest days of the year. The anniversary was widely observed. A very large number went to St. Patrick's Church, where religious services of the day were appropriately celebrated. Many also attended the early masses at St. Bridget's and Joseph's Churches. At the College of Ottawa the students assisted at a special service.

NEW YORK, March 17.—Brilliant weather favored the Irishmen of New York in their celebration of St. Patrick's day. Two successful parades were held. The first procession was reviewed by the mayor.

THE COURTS.

Opening of the Spring Assizes at Guelph, March 18.—The Spring Assizes opened here yesterday, Chief Justice Armour presiding. There are only cases on the civil docket, including a money suit, another of slander and

breach of promise. There is only one criminal case, one of alleged child murder which occurred in Mount Forest last October, William Coultts of that place accused of drowning his child in a pond. In addressing the grand jury Justice Gilmour, referring to the treatment of prisoners in jails, said he sometimes thought they were better treated and had more comforts there than many of the people

The first case taken up was Clara Holliday. This action was brought by Clara, widow of William Clarke, damages for the death of her husband, it is said, was caused by intoxication at the defendant's brew on the 30th August last, and while in that state being struck on his way to the local Grand Trunk train. A num-

witnesses were examined and much contradictory evidence given. The case was argued under one of the provisions of the License Act, which permits the representative, where death is caused by intoxication, to recover damages of \$1,000. This case occupied the whole day, after an hour's deliberation the jury turned a verdict at 8:10 of \$750 damages.
