THE LOCAL MARKET

A few loads of hay and oats made up the local market this morning. Hay to \$14 yesterday, on account of the wet weather. There should be a good demand for the rest of the week. No hay will be sold to be sold on Saturday, unless previously bargained for. One load of oats sold for \$1.70 per cwt, which is probably a record price for this time of the year. They were sold at \$1.60 a cwt. last year.

Trade in futures was quiet, and the demand for cash wheat was less active. Wheat options were 1 1/2c to 1 3/4c lower at closing.
