GERMANS DRIVEN BACK NEAR THORN

Russians Say Left Wing of
Enemy in Poland Is Partly
Enveloped.

HEADED FOR CRACOW

Roumania Getting Aroused
Over Advance Into
Hungary.

ROME, via London, Oct. 8.—9:17 p.m.—A dispatch to the Tribune from Petrograd says the Russians have driven the Germans from Vlodavsk, Russian Poland, 35 miles southeast of Thorn, East Prussia, and have fortified themselves within a few miles of the fortress of Thorn.

The German left wing in Poland, according to the dispatch, is said to have been partly enveloped.

In Conquered Districts.

LONDON, Oct. 8.—19:17 p.m.—A Petrograd dispatch to Reuters' Telegram Company says the Russians have completed the administrative organization of the conquered regions around Lemberg, which has been made into a province divided into thirteen districts. The Russian troops, adds the dispatch, are advancing slowly, but irresistibly upon Cracow, the population of which has already been reduced by one half.

Great Battle Line.

A great battle line between the combined Austro-German armies and the legions of Russia extends from the Galician frontier, near Tarnow, right north to the East Prussian border. Another Russian force is besieging Przemyśl in Galicia, and still another is invading Hungary. On the East Prussian frontier the fighting appears to have come to a standstill for the present.

The Russians having driven the Germans back, after their advance to the Niemen River, found on getting to the German border that reinforcements had been brought from Königsberg, and their further progress was arrested. The Germans, in fact, claim to have defeated the Russians near Suwalki, and to have taken 2,700 prisoners and nine machine guns.

Fighting on a larger scale will soon be resumed, and it will then be decided whether the Germans are to invade Russia in this region or the Russians are again to overrun Prussia.

Claim Victory in Galicia.
In southwestern Poland the Austrian German armies have advanced along both banks of the Vistula River with the object of compelling the Russians to evacuate part of Galicia, and, according to their reports, have defeated them, capturing 4,800.

The Russians reply that they allowed the enemy to advance so far as the Opotow-Sandomir front, in order to force them to abandon their strongly entrenched position near Kielce and accept battle in the open country, closing this battle neither has come through concerning the movements of the two armies.

The advance of the Russians into Hungary has aroused intense feeling in Roumania with respect to Transylvania, and a section of that country is advocating that Roumania join the Allies, so that with the end of the war, should victory rest with the Allies, Roumania may fall heir to that part of the Austro-Hungarian Empire.

BERLIN FUND WILL EXCEED \$90,000 MARK

Time Extended as Offerings Continue to
Pour In.

BERLIN, Oct. 8.—Instead of the campaign for the raising of funds for the Canadian Patriotic Fund, closing last night, the time has been extended for several days more as subscriptions are still coming in. The amount as tabulated so far has reached the total of \$86,181, and it is a safe assertion that when all the returns have been received the total for the city of Berlin may exceed \$90,000.

President S. J. Williams and his

workers are delighted with the result. The total amount reached is greater than was anticipated.

SHIPLOAD OF RELIEF FOR STRICKEN BELGIANS

sult of the appeal made by Hon. G. H. Murray, the people of Nova Scotia have donated a shipload of clothing and provisions for the relief of the distressed Belgians. The British admiralty has placed a ship at the disposal of the committee to transport the gifts to Belgium direct. The ship will sail from Halifax during the week beginning Oct. 19.

are taking advantage of the opportunity to send their contributions on the Nova Scotia ship.
