CANADIAN NATIONAL MADE A RECORD

Port Arthur.-The Canadian National Railways came within 23 cars of equalling its record of October 31s in the number of cars of grain handled to the elevator cities of Port Arthur and Fort William, in the twenty-four hour period between Saturday and Sunday midnight. In this

urday and Sunday midnight. In this period the railway landed 1.512 cars at the head of the lakes and disposed of 974 to elevators.

The Canadian National claims the 1923 record for grain handling with 1.535 cars laid down in the 24 hours period ending October 31st. On November 5th the Canadian Pacific reported its best as 1,438.
