ROCHESTER, N. Y.—A City and Port of Entry, situated on Genesce River, 8 miles from its entrance intellake Ontario. It is noted for its important literary and other institutions, and for its extensive manufactures, minly promoted by the great water power here afforded by the Genesce River. Within the City limits there are lires excessive perpendicular falls of 9i, 20, and 105 feet; and through the entire distance from the upper to the ower faltheriver flows through a ravine more than 100 feet deep. Rochester, from its contiguity to the Eric Canal and Ike Ontario, and from its extensive railway connections, cujoys great facilities for transportation of its imports and exports in 1812 there were only two wooden frame buildings on the spot, each consisting of a single room and when, a few yers before, a proposal was made in the State Legislature to build here a bridge across the cases, it was strongly opposed, ad a member declared that it was "a God-forsaken place, inhabited by muskrats, and visited only by strageting trappers." Distant from Albany 229 miles, from Buffalo 68 miles, from Toronto 110 miles, and from Montreal (via Kingston) 280 miles. Population about 43,000.
