The prospects of spring for the last two weeks have been favorable, being a continued season of good weather, with only a few days of wet and min. We have no change of any importance to note in the state of our markets. Breadstuffs are in some departments dull and in others active. Spring wheat has advanced, and four, a fow days age, showed some briskness, although transactions are small for want of freight, and are confined wholly to f. o. b., and among our merchants and dedera. The street market is very small, and sear-ely worth reporting. The opening of navigation, which will be fairly commenced in another week, will doubtless add a briskness to trade in exporting the wheat and flour lying is store at our wharves and elevators.
