are not found in other tissues, either normal or pathological. That they are not accidentally present, but are causative agents of the disease, is to be inferred from their regular disposition and the relation which they bear to the cells of a new growth.

CACHETS FOL AMENORRH(EA.---The Indépendance médicale for January 5th attributes the following formula to Bloom :

R Strychnine sulphate	
Ovalid acid	
Manganese lactate, ) Iron peptonate, ) each	. 120 "
Compound extract of colocynth	. 30 "

M. Divide into sixty cachets. One to be taken about an hour before each of the principal meals.—New York Medical Journal.

SIALORRHEA CURED BY THE REDUCTION OF A RETROFLENED GRAVID UTERUS.—Audebert (*Revue Obstet. Internationale*) mentions the case of a young woman, whose first pregnancy had been followed by infectious endometritis ind consequent retroflexion, and who soon after conceiving a second time was attacked by severe and exhausting ptyalism, and when Audebert saw her in the third month was extremely emaciated. In addition to what was sivallowed or soaked up on her linen 800 grammes of liquid were collected in 24 hours. Her gravid uterus was found in extreme retroflexion, the cervix lying forward above the symphysis. Reduction was effected easily in the genu-pectoral position and prevented from recurring. The sialorrheea at once diminished and ceased absolutely at the end of three days.—British Medical Journal.

A SOLUTION FOR STOPPING FAILING OF THE HAIR.... The Revue de Therapeutique gives the following :

R Hydrochlorate of quinine, 5 j. Tannic acid, 5 ij.
Alcohol (70 per cent.). O iss. Tinct. of cantharides, 5 iiss.
Pure glycerine, 5 iss.
Cologne aq., 5 x.
Vanillin, gr. ij.
Pulv. sandalwood, 5 j.

This mixture, after being well mixed and shaken, is allowed to stand for four days, and is then filtered. It is rubbed into the scalp daily for the purpose named.—*Therapeutic Gazette*.
