#### THE TRADE OF CANADA.

Mr. Fortin recently brought before the House of Commons a number of figures relating to the trade of the Dominion with tropical countries, in support of a motion for "all correspondence and papers relat-"ing to reciprocal trade agreements "between the Government of Brazil, the "different Governments of the West "India Islands, whether British or Foreign "and Mexicon." We are under the impression that a return of a similar character had already been moved for by Mr.
