BRITISH COLUMBIA RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

In the attendance of spectators and competitors, the eighteenth prize meeting of the British Columbia Rifle Association, held at Goldstream, is a decided improvement upon the meeting of last year. The weather was all that the riflemen could desire, although the wind was a little too puffy for first-class scores. Before the formal opening of the meeting, extra series C and D were taken up, the firing at 500 yards continuing until the arrival of the Lieutenant-Governor, with Mrs. Nelson and party, at the range.

At 11 o'clock, Mrs. Nelson fired the opening shot, Lieut.-Col. Holmes, D.A.G., acting as her arm bearer. Then Lt.-Col. Wolfenden extended the formal welcome of the Association to the Governor and his consort, and the former replied in a short but thoroughly suitable speech. Col. Holmes also spoke briefly, and the real work of the meeting commenced. Capt. Peele, the range officer, had everything in good condition, though the range is just a little too dusty to be pleasant.
