Hay .- Not much doing, and baled offering at \$4.00 to \$4.50 per ton at point of shipment.

The light movement has sustained values, and prices would almost certainly be lower with any considerable increase in offerings. Local prices are irregular, and though we quote 22 to 24c per bushel on track here, a close quotation cannot be given in the absence of so much business. 
