

Resident Canadian Corporations:

At present there are two, Alcan and Bata. However, at least three more are establishing a presence--Lavalin Corporation in oil and gas, Crippen Consultants in hydroelectric and Swan Wooster in port development. The Royal Bank opened an office in Bangkok in 1982.

- Multilateral Aid: Since 1978 Canada has contributed \$24.9 million through multilateral organizations and NGOs for Indochinese refugees relief. \$22.6 million has been designated for displaced Thais and refugees in Thailand, and \$2.3 million for emergency relief inside Cambodia.
