

6. PARTICIPATION IN THE FISHERIES INDUSTRY OF NEW ENGLAND

Participation in the harvesting or fishing sector has declined in recent years, reflecting the declining availability of resource. Both the numbers of vessels and of fishermen decreased between 1983 and 1986, but it is felt that overcapacity remains a problem. The estimated revenue per fisherman employed in vessels of 5 gross tons or more in 1986 has been the lowest (in deflated terms) since 1928.
