The Secretary of State for External Affairs, the Honourable Paul Martin, announced today that a Canadian Consulate will be opened in Cleveland, Ohio, on Wednesday, September 16. It will be headed by Arthur Worden Evans of the Canadian Trade Commissioner Service, who has been appointed Consul and Trade Commissioner.

Mr. Evans, who was born in Kingston, Ontario, in 1917, received his Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Toronto. Enlisting in the RCAF in 1940, he later transferred to the Fleet Air Arm of the Royal Navy and then to the Royal Canadian Navy, receiving his discharge as a lieutenant in 1945. He has served in Canadian trade offices in Mexico City, Port-of-Spain, Havana, Cape Town and Liverpool. Since 1961 he has served the Department of Trade and Commerce in the Commonwealth Division of the Office of Trade Relations and Trade Policy.
