DIPLOMATIC APPOINTMENTS

The Honourable Allan J. MacEachen, Deputy Prime Minister and Secretary of State for External Affairs, announces the following appointments:

R. David Jackson (47) originally from Vancouver, B.C., to be Ambassador to Lebanon, with concurrent accreditation to Syria.

Mr. Jackson (B.A.(Hon.), University of British Columbia; University of Hamburg; London School of Economics) joined the Department of External Affairs in 1960. He has served abroad in Berlin, Hanoi, Saigon, Vientiane and Hong Kong. Since 1981 he has been Foreign Service Visitor at the University of Moncton. Mr. Jackson will replace Mr. Theodore Arcand who has been appointed as Ambassador to Hungary.

Frederick G. Livingston (50) originally from Montreal, Quebec, to be High Commissioner to Ghana, with concurrent accreditation to Togo.

Mr. Livingston (B.A.(Hon.) Political Science, University of Western Ontario; post-graduate studies at the London School of Economics) was a member of the Department of External Affairs from 1963 to 1973, at which time he joined the Department of Finance. From 1976-80 he served as Head of Economic Development Division at the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development in Paris. Since 1980 he has been Director-General of the Development Policy Bureau, Policy Branch, at the Canadian International Development Agency. Mr. Livingston is replacing Mr. Marc Faguy who has returned to Canada.
